



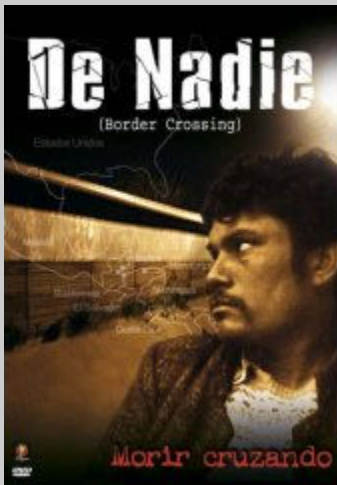
From the South to the North through Mexico: Two Films that Tell the Undocumented Story

De Nadie

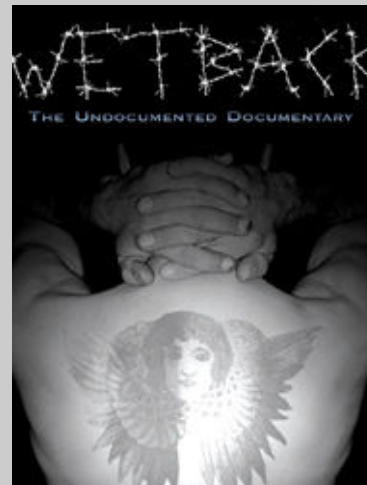
Mexico, 2005, Tim Dirdamal, 80 min.
