Honorable Tyisha Walker-Myers President, New Haven Board of Alders

Dear President Walker-Myers,

We would like to respectfully submit to the Board of Alders the attached Order calling for a public hearing regarding the City's lighting policy. Residents from neighborhoods across the City have expressed grave concern about dark stretches on some of the City's busiest roadways. Residents have noted that lighting is not only critical for traffic safety, but that it also serves as a deterrent for criminal behavior.

Recently there has been an alarming increase in the number of pedestrian crashes, many of which have been fatal. Various factors may have contributed to causing these incidents and a public hearing can help us investigate whether City lighting policy can be improved to prevent future incidents.

We are specifically interested in how lighting can help improve safety for pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists; what standards are used to determine whether a street is well-let; and what type of lighting best promotes public safety and health. It would be valuable to better understand when the City chooses to install new lights, upgrade existing lights, and install different styles of lighting (e.g. mounted to utility poles versus decorative poles).

A public hearing will address these concerns expressed and consider solutions from the appropriate City departments which must include but are not limited to public safety and traffic calming.

Thank you for your consideration of this request to hold a public hearing before the appropriate aldermanic committee to discuss the City's lighting policy.
